

TUESDAY TRIPLES

RULES

1. Play shall be in accordance with KCBA / Bowls England Rules
2. Cost of entry to the competition is determined by the Bowling Committee
3. Dress shall be Blacks as defined in the Constitution and Rules, "Club Matters / Club Rules / By-laws" 8.2 / Dress Code / Internal League.
4. Each match will be played over 15 ends.
One shot will be counted for the closest bowl to the Jack on the first end only, thereafter all bowls count.
Two points being awarded to the winning team, none to the losing team and, in the event of a draw, one point awarded to each team.
5. The following shall apply when teams have fewer than 3 players:
 - 5.1 The defaulting team with at least two players will have a lead playing with four bowls and the skip with three; the non-defaulting team will have two players using two bowls and the skip using three. The defaulting team will lose 25% of its score, rounded up or down to the nearest whole number, halves being rounded up.
Should both teams have only two players available then all four players play 15 ends with 3 woods and both teams have 25% of their scores deducted.
 - 5.2 A team unable to field at least two players will forfeit the match. In this circumstance, 2 points will be awarded to the non-defaulting team and no points to the defaulting team. No shots for or against will be awarded to either team.
6. Substitutes may be used subject to the following criteria:
 - A substitute must not be a member of any other Tuesday Triple team
 - A substitute must not skip
 - Once a substitute has played for a given team, the substitute may not play for any other Tuesday Triple team.
7. In the event of matches being cancelled or abandoned before twelve ends have been played, teams will be awarded one point each with the exception of a team that is resting which shall be awarded no points. However, if 12 ends have been completed, the match will be deemed to have been played and the scores will stand at the point of abandonment.
